## MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CONRAD, COUNTY OF PONDERA, STATE OF MONTANA, HELD AT CONRAD CITY HALL ON MARCH, 21 2023

The City Council of the City of Conrad, County of Pondera, State of Montana, met in regular session at the Conrad City Hall on MARCH 21,2023 at 6:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Miller at 6:00 p.m.

Motion by Alderman Breding, second by Alderman Schoenrock, to approve the minutes from the March 7,2023 regular meeting and March 13,2023 special meeting, as presented.

Public Comment: None

Discussion/Action: Pondera County 4-H Ambassador Request (Street Dance) Mr. Waldusky could not be here but provided correspondence with the request to host a street dance during Whoop Up (June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2023 from 7pm to 11pm). The request is to have the dance in the same place as last year (6<sup>th</sup> avenue on the pool block) including a request for access to electricity from the pool. Dave will ask the Police Chief if there were any complaints last year. PWD Zimbelman reported that this 4-H group left the place clean last year, the dance was from 7pm to 11pm, and no problems were encountered.

Discussion/Action: Conrad Chamber of Commerce Request for Norley Hall Use (4 days) for Annual Meeting and Banquet. April 20th thru April 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023.

Motion by Alderman Schoenrock, second by Alderman Cates, to approve the use of Norley Hall by the Conrad Chamber of Commerce.

Discussion/Action: Agreement for financial services. A clerk from another town shared with MMIA/Montana League of City and Towns that our clerk resigned. Montana League of City and Towns has provided an opportunity to contract some assistance with the clerk financial duties during the interim of finding a replacement. The priorities of focus are the Annual Financial Report (AFR), bringing balancing up to date, and assistance with the budget. The Agreement provides assistance at \$50.00 an hour with a cap of \$2,000.00. The Mayor asked if council could approve a higher cap amount as the amount of work to be done may use this capped amount quickly. Council asked several questions as to how this contract would work. The Mayor agreed there are many outstanding questions and all the details are yet to be determined. Alderman Cates and Alderman Breding suggested that we do this first contract see how it goes and can look at another contract if needed.

Motion by Alderman Cates, second by Alderman Hunsucker to accept the financial services contract.

Motion Carried Unanimously

Discussion: City water hook-up- Citizen Inquiry. Mr. Wheeler met with the Mayor last week. The Mayor directed him to tonight's Council Meeting to present his questions regarding access to city water at an out-of-town property. Mr. Wheeler informed council that 40 acres of land was purchased, by the Busch Ag Elevator, and he would like to know what is needed, and/or if possible, to place a 4-inch water line to the new location. PWD Zimbelman talked with the City Engineer he said a 4-inch pipe would not be a problem, theoretically. Although looping in by Russell and Johnson would be a longer distance, it would only require one right of way (Pondera County). The shortest way (by the elevator) would require three right-of-ways. Alderman Schoenrock asked about Sewer. Mr. Wheeler said it would be a septic and no city sewer would be requested. PWD Zimbelman informed all present that the upcoming storm water project, which will start next summer, would be near this water main. PWD Zimbelman will check with the City Engineer about the depths. Mayor Miller stated the first step would be to get a water contract, followed by verifying the plans with the Engineers, paying system development fees, etc. Mr. Wheeler was given a water contract application during the meeting.

Discussion/Action: Engineering Bid Received: The city received one Bid (Triple Tree Engineering).

Motion by Alderman Breding second by Alderman Schoenrock to accept he Triple Tree Engineering bid proposal.

Motion Carried Unanimously

Executive Session: None

Other Business: Bids were received for the Lift Station project: a total of three bids were received. The plan is present the three bids to council at a future meeting. The lowest bid must be chosen. PWD Zimbelman reviewed the bypass feature included in the bids with Council. Per the PWD, we have never had to have a bypass on the lift stations before and there could be potential leaks. PWD Zimbelman discussed it further with the City Engineer and determined the bypass system was not needed at this time. Mayor Miller understood this as well after discussing herself with the engineer and the city PWD. Due to the urgent need, a special meeting was to determined to be necessary in order to select the lowest bidder/contractor for the lift station project. The Mayor agreed to post the agenda for the special meeting to be held Friday, the 24th of March, at 3:00 pm.

Items to appear on next agenda: Health insurance rates.

Items tabled at prior meetings/ongoing and/or to be added to future agenda: Water, Sewer, Garbage Rate Increases, Blue Sky Villa Surplus letter. Meeting with BSV next week

There being no further business to come before the council, motion by Alderman Hunsucker, second by Alderman Cates, to adjourn the meeting at 7:05 p.m.
